Hopedale has joined with other libraries in the Blackstone Valley to offer an online pass reservation system and expanded access to participating library's passes. This means that Hopedale residents now have access to more passes than they previously did. Passes must be picked up and returned to the owning library and can be reserved up to 30 days in advance.
