During World War II, many patrons of the Town Hall Spa (located where the Town Common is now) brought photos of family members serving in the armed forces to the Spa, where they were displayed on a wall. In the 1990s, the pictures were given to the Bancroft Memorial Library, framed and hung in a downstairs hallway. Dan Malloy has worked on identifying more of the pictures and has re-organized them.
