This multimedia lecture will focus on the steps to growing better quality food from seed to harvest by working with the biological systems present. Discussion will include land management practices to overcome limiting factors of a plant's genetic potential, stages of immunity, pest and disease resistance and more! Come learn about steps you can take to improve the flavor, aroma and shelf life of the average backyard crop. Handouts will be available. A Q & A session will close out the lecture.

As an avid part-time gardener, Gary was inspired to join the Bionutrient Food Association (BFA) in 2012 after taking a BFA course and seeing the impact of biological farming practices in his own backyard. After gaining extensive field experience, he went on to become a course administrator with the BFA and was active in the organization from July 2012 until April 2018.
