Safe Child Policy

Children are always welcome in our library! We encourage them to visit and develop their love of reading.

However, the library is a public place and your child's safety is important to us. Parents and caregivers, not library staff, are responsible for the actions and safety of the children visiting the library.

Please help us keep your children safe by following our policy:

Children Under 8

Must be accompanied by an adult or caregiver at all times, whether upstairs or downstairs.

If the child is participating in a program, the parent or caregiver must remain in the Children's area until the end of the program.

Children Aged 9 and Over

May be left unattended at the discretion of a responsible adult.

Will be expected to display appropriate behavior.

Must be able to reach an adult in an emergency.

At closing time, police may be notified to escort unattended children from the library.

Display Case

Please stop by our display case to see the Old Paper Money Collection (1776-1929) on loan by Dr. Damien Domenech. The American Revolution (1765-1783) by the United Colonies required finances greater than the amount of gold and silver in the



colonies. Paper money was then issued to finance the war. It wasn't until 1861 and the start of the Civil War that the first "United States Notes" appeared. American paper money is the longest continuously issued currency in the world.

We would like to thank Dr. Domenech for the opportunity to display his collection.


<u>Friday, June 21 Museum of Science – Rockets:</u> There and Back:
