Summer Reading Wrap-up: Bancroft Memorial Library's 2017 Summer Reading Program was a success with 186 children, from preschool thru grade 9, taking part in "Build a Better World". Over a six-week period, these young people read at least 3 hours weekly, attended some of 40 library activities, and collected prizes from several sponsors: Green Mountain Chocolate, Chipotle's Restaurant, JJ's Ice Cream, Domino's Pizza, Moe's Restaurant, and Milford Dairy Queen. They took part in a weekly raffle for Barnes & Noble gift cards, sponsored by the Friends of the Library. Favorite programs included a Teddy Bear Picnic with Jason Julian, two Pressed Flower Art workshops with Karina James, a High-Tech Workshop in Forensics, and "Beauty and The Beast," performed by the Hampstead Stage Company. This finale to our program was attended by 129 parents and children, who also enjoyed a sundae party, provided by the Friends of the Hopedale Library.
