Scam Proof Your Life

They say they want to help you.

Their voices are so nice and friend-

ly. They call and email from phone numbers and emails that look legitimate. They tell you that you have won a prize or money. They scare you and tell you that there is a problem with a family member, your bank account, Social Security benefit, retirement pension, your credit card, EBT card, a package or your home.

THEY ARE TRYING TO SCAM YOU! SLOW DOWN! STOP! THEY ARE LYING. Seniors please don't:

- Respond to that strange threatening phone call
- Send money or store gift cards to someone who says a family member is in trouble or under arrest or that you need to send money in order to collect your "prize"
- Provide any bank or other personal information to someone who says you have won money
- Click that email link
- Give out any of your security codes
- Give your Social Security number or Bank account number to anyone over the phone
- Give out code numbers that have been texted or emailed to you
- Pay anyone who comes to your door randomly offering to do repair work on your home
- Open your door to someone you do not know

These scammers are trying to steal your personal information. Scammers can make it look like they are calling from a real number. Don't trust your Caller ID! · Slow down and get help from the COA, Police or a friend if you are worried about a call, letter or email. The Hopedale Police Department will NEVER call you demanding money or threaten that you are going to be arrested! Even if the number says it is the Hopedale Police Department, it is NOT. If you encounter something suspicious and believe it may be a scam, call the Hopedale Police. The Council on Aging is here to help as well.

Tai Chi


