VETERANS' SERVICES (FOR VETERANS AND SPOUSES OF VETERANS)

MEDICARE, MEDICAID AND HEALTH AND DRUG INSURANCE

COUNSELING SHINE PROGRAM

Information and assistance is available on all aspects of Medicare coverage and assistance plans available through Medicare & Medicaid. Supplemental health and drug insurance coverage information and assistance for Medicare eligible individuals.

HOME REPAIR (May be on hold due to COVID-19)

Any senior age sixty (60) and older, who owns and resides in their home, can apply for home repair assistance. *The repair must be deemed a safety concern* in order to qualify for this service. There is no income guideline for this program.

New applications available for fuel season effective **Nov. 1, 2021. Re-certifications going out in Sept.** Program open to renters and home owners. All forms of heating eligible.

FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM - FREE

The Sr. Center will provide you with a magnetic card that can be placed on your refrigerator or carried in your purse. The pre-printed card has space for emergency contact numbers, your current medications as well as you attending physicians' names and phone numbers. In the event of an emergency if you are unable to communicate, the card may provide information critical to your care.

HOUSE NUMBER SIGNS PROGRAM - FREE

A wooden number sign is available to all Hopedale residents. As a public safety measure, all residences are required to display house numbers. The TRIAD program will provide you with **free** house number sign. Please contact us for more information on how to obtain a free house number sign.



Anxiety Management Program

Coming to Hopedale Sr. Center

Yoga-Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (Y-CBT) is a class that weaves together the relaxing effects of simple chair yoga and meditation with traditional

therapeutic techniques. By working with both mind and body, you'll find that you feel better and are able to look at things in new ways. The groups are humorous—so you'll have some fun! Classes will be led by Mental Health Professionals from Riverside Community Care. Overall, you'll learn skills that will decrease your anxiety and stress and can even help you feel better about yourself.

There are six 1.5 hour sessions, followed by one review session about 2 months later. Each session teaches different skills covering topics that including:

What is anxiety?

How does anxiety affect my thoughts and my body? How does anxiety affect the way I relate to others?

Classes are free and will begin at a date to be announced in April of 2022. Please call the Hopedale Sr. Center for details and registration.


