Confidential counseling, caregiver support, information and referral services are available on aging issues for seniors and caregivers.



VETERANS' SERVICES FOR VETERANS AND SPOUSES OF VETERANS

Confidential counseling with our Veterans' Agent, Pat Morris. Individuals issues or medical conditions do not have to be "service-related".



MEDICARE, MEDICAID AND HEALTH AND DRUG INSURANCE COUNSELING SHINE PROGRAM

Information and assistance is available on all aspects of Medicare coverage and assistance plans available through Medicare & Medicaid. Supplemental health and drug insurance coverage information and assistance for Medicare eligible individuals.

HOME REPAIR (May be on hold due to COVID-19)

Any senior age sixty (60) and older, who owns and resides in their home, can apply for home repair assistance. The repair must be deemed a safety concern in order to qualify for this service. There is no income guideline for this program.

FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM - FREE

The Sr. Center will provide you with a magnetic card that can be placed on your refrigerator or carried in your purse. The pre-printed card has space for emergency contact num-

bers, your current medications as well as you attending physicians' names and phone numbers. In the event of an emergency if you are unable to communicate, the card may provide information critical to your care.

HOUSE NUMBER SIGNS PROGRAM - FREE

A wooden number sign is available to all Hopedale residents. As a public safety measure, all residences are required to display house numbers. The TRIAD program will provide you with free house number sign. Please contact us for more information on how to obtain a free house number sign.

Medicare Open Enrollment begins on October 15th through December 7th for Plan Year 2021

Open Enrollment

Every year, Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage (HMO, PPO) plans can change their premiums, co-pays, deductibles, formularies (list of drugs cov-

ered) and preferred pharmacies. In the case of Medicare Advantage Plans they can also drop providers from their Plan. Your Plan mailed this information to you in September. It's important to review your information every year, to make sure you have the plan that works best for you for next year.

REMEMBER!! YOU NEED TO BE SURE THAT YOUR PRIMARY CARE PHYSICIAN AND OTHER PROVIDERS ARE COVERED IN THE PLANS NETWORK BEFORE YOU CHANGE TO A DIFFERENT MEDICARE PLAN. YOU SHOULD ALSO BE SURE YOUR MEDICATIONS ARE COVERED IN YOUR PLAN AS WELL.

Assistance is available from the SHINE program. Call the Hopedale Senior Center at **(508)634-2208** and ask for a SHINE appointment. Trained SHINE volunteers offer free, confidential counseling on all aspects of health insurance to anyone on Medicare.

FLU CLINICS FOR HOPEDALE RESIDENTS

Help is available. The Fuel Assistance program helps income eligible households pay a portion of their heating costs. If your gross income falls within the limits shown below you may be eligible. You may also qualify for electricity discounts and weatherization programs. All inquires and applications are con-
