The Hopedale Sr. Center is Open by Appointment

Yes, the Board of Health has given us a green light to let individuals into to the Sr. Center on a "by appointment" basis only. We want to review the new safety procedures that are required for entry into the building:

- Appointments are required (duration is 1 hour maximum)
- Individuals only unless you require the assistance of a caretaker or a companion
- All entrants must answer a series of COVID-19 questions and sign an entry log
- Submit to a temperature screening
- Wear a protective face covering at all times
- Sanitize hands before entering the Sr. Center
- Maintain a 6 foot distance with Staff
- Refrain from consuming drinks or food in the Sr. Center

Please remember that access into the Sr. Center is at the discretion of the Sr. Center staff. In addition, high contact surface areas will be cleaned between visitors. The Sr. Center's full COVID-19 protocol can be viewed on the town 's Web page under the COA tab.

OUTREACH SERVICES

Confidential counseling, caregiver support, information and referral services are available on aging issues for seniors and caregivers.

VETERANS' SERVICES FOR VETERANS AND SPOUSES OF VETERANS

Confidential counseling with our Veterans' Agent, Pat Morris. Individuals issues or medical conditions do not have to be "service-related".

MEDICARE, MEDICAID AND HEALTH AND DRUG INSURANCE COUNSELING SHINE PROGRAM

Information and assistance is available on all aspects of Medicare coverage and assistance plans available through Medicare & Medicaid. Supplemental health and drug insurance coverage information and assistance for Medicare eligible individuals.

HOME REPAIR (May be on hold due to COVID-19)

Any senior age sixty (60) and older, who owns and resides in their home, can apply for home repair assistance. *The repair must be deemed a safety concern* in order to qualify for this service. There is no income guideline for this program.

FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM - FREE

The Sr. Center will provide you with a magnetic card that can be placed on your refrigerator or carried in your purse. The pre-printed card has space for emergency contact num-

bers, your current medications as well as you attending physicians' names and phone numbers. In the event of an emergency if you are unable to communicate, the card may provide information critical to your care.

HOUSE NUMBER SIGNS PROGRAM - FREE

A wooden number sign is available to all Hopedale residents. As a public safety measure, all residences are required to display house numbers. The TRIAD program will provide you with **free** house number sign. Please contact us for more information on how to obtain a free house number sign.

SR. CENTER ERRAND VAN

Seniors and disabled adults who don't drive and need transportation may use the Sr. Center van to go grocery shopping, personal shopping or to go to the bank, hair salon, barber or other local non-medical destinations. The current van schedule is:

Monday through Thursday

9:00 am - 2:00 pm (Times and dates subject to availability of the driver.)

The cost for most roundtrips is \$3.00. Please call to schedule an appointment at least forty-eight (48) hours before your appointment.

If you would like to use the Hopedale Sr. Center van you must register as a van rider by calling the Sr. Center at (508)634-2208. The van will come directly to your home and pick you up!

COVID-19 Requirements:


All van riders will be required to:

- Answer screening questions
- Have temperature taken
- Wear a mask
- Use hand-sanitizer before taking a seat



The van's high-contact surfaces will be wiped-down with sanitizing cloths between trips. There is a two (2) person maximum on each trip. Please let us know if you have particular questions or concerns. We can assist with your van rider registration.

The van is available through a partnership between the town of Hopedale and The MetroWest Regional Transit Authority. The service offers Hopedale residents a wonderful opportunity for expanded transportation services. Spread the word.

NEWS FROM SHINE IMPORTANT MAIL ABOUT YOUR DRUG AND HEALTH



PLANS!

It's that time ! If you have a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO, PPO), your Plan will mail you an information packet called an ANNUAL NO-TICE OF CHANGE by the end of September. It is important to **understand** and **save** this information because it explains the changes in your plan for **2021.**

Your plan premiums, deductibles, copays, providers and covered drugs may change significantly! This is important information and if you do not understand it, you should discuss it with your family or caregivers. During the current COVID crisis, we will not be doing on site presentations at senior centers. We will make presentations available on our website, www.shinema.org, and also through your local cable channel. During the annual Medicare Open Enrollment Period (October 15th - December 7th), you will have a chance to CHANGE your plan for next year. SHINE's certified Medicare counselors can help you understand your plan changes, as well as other options you may have. Trained SHINE (Serving Health Information Needs of Everyone) counselors can help you! We offer, unbiased, confidential counseling on all aspects of health insurance to anyone on Medicare. Call the Hopedale Sr. Center at (508) 634-2208 and ask for a SHINE appointment.
