Hopedale voters will be asked to decide whether the town should be allowed to assess an additional

\$430,000 in real estate and personal property taxes for the purposes of funding the Town's Operational Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019.

While this article passed at the recent Annual Town Meeting, the town must additionally obtain a majority vote from residents at the polls to enact the override.

The Finance Committee will be forwarding a letter to all residents detailing the impact of a "yes" or "no" vote.

# ATTENTION ALL SMOC (Fuel Assistance) PARTICIPANTS



Late in August you should receive your "recertification" paperwork for 2019 - 2020.

We urge everyone to complete and return their forms as soon as possible. Delays in returning documents will impact the approval of your fuel assistance benefit for the coming season.

The Sr. Center can assist you with any questions and problems. Again, at this time we can only address recertification cases.

The fuel season begins on *November 1, 2019*. We will take applications for new clients late in October 2019.

Fuel assistance is available to renters and homeowners regardless of their heating source (oil, electric, gas, propane or wood). Some applicants may qualify for additional weatherization benefits.

Information and assistance is available on all aspects of Medicare coverage and assistance plans available through Medicare & Medicaid. Supplemental health and drug insurance coverage information and assistance for Medicare eligible individuals.

#### HOME REPAIR

Any senior age sixty (60) and older, who owns and resides in their home, can apply for home repair assistance. *The repair must be deemed a safety concern* in order to qualify for this service. There is no income guideline for this program.

#### FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM - FREE

The Sr. Center will provide you with a magnetic card that can be placed on your refrigerator or carried in your purse. The pre-printed card has space for emergency contact numbers, your current medications as well as you attending physicians' names and phone numbers. In the event of an emergency if you are unable to communicate, the card may provide information critical to your care.

#### HOUSE NUMBER SIGNS PROGRAM - FREE

A wooden number sign is available to all Hopedale residents. As a public safety measure, all residences are required to display house numbers. The TRIAD program will provide you with **free** house number sign. Please contact us for more information on how to obtain a free house number sign.



# NEWS FROM SHINE FOR AUGUST 2019 Staying Healthy with No Cost Medicare Preventative Benefits

An important goal for Medicare is to help people stay healthy by encouraging prevention. Medicare provides a number of preventive services. These services are free whether you have traditional Medicare or a Medicare Advantage plan, like an HMO. Some of these services include:

Colorectal cancer screening (including colonoscopies)

Mammograms

Pap tests and pelvic exams

Prostate cancer screening

Bone mass measurements

Cardiovascular screening

Flu and pneumonia shots

Alcohol misuse screening and counseling

Depression screening

Obesity screening and counseling

There are very specific rules which state when and how often Medicare will pay for the above services. For a complete list of free preventive services, go to www.medicare.gov or see a SHINE counselor.
