These are released as tires wear down, especially during braking and acceleration. Brake pads also release Hazardous chemicals. The proposed facility will have an extremely large amount of vehicles on the property. This pollution will be added to the groundwater and storm water runoff on the property site along with the exhaust emissions' Hazardous chemicals. I have forwarded this to the Conservation Commission and Planning Board. I was unable to find an email address for the Board of Health, and would ask that this email be forwarded to the BOH, if possible. They are listed as each receiving a copy of the application under 17.7(b), Procedures for Issuance of Special Permit, for their written recommendations, if there are any, now or in the future. I would also like my correspondence dated 11/3/2021 and 3/2/2022 to be included for consideration at the ZBA meeting Wednesday 1/11/2023 and in any future decisions by the other involved Town Boards. The concerns in these previous correspondence were never addressed. There were also questions asked of the applicant by residents that were never answered.
